We have decided to increase the number of students to 12 (six per week) to allow two more students the opportunity to take part. LK shared copies of the application form. The questions we ask on the application form help us assess the applicants' interest in science and medicine. However, deciding on the successful applicants is always difficult as we receive 50 plus applications. To help us further with the selection process, it was decided to include two additional questions/sections in which the student will enter NDS Work their gender and will let us know if they have applied to our work experience programme before. We Experience discussed the idea of asking for a reference from their teacher, however, we believe this would Programme perhaps discriminate those students from state schools that may find it difficult to gain a reference. Some students from state schools have commented that they do not receive any help from their teachers to secure a work experience placement. LK also informed the working group that some of the students commented that they would have liked to have seen more information about the NDS work experience programme on our website. LK will add more photos and quotes from past students, and will also add some quotes from staff members who ran sessions. In addition, LK will add examples of what sessions were ran during past work experience weeks.
